PARENTAL ALIENATION AWARENESS DAY PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, Parental Alienation is defined as the mental manipulation of children that destroys a child's relationship with a loving parent; and

WHEREAS, the main arena where Parental Alienation is found in high conflict divorce and custody disputes; and

WHEREAS, professionals have defined parents who engage in this manipulation as The Alienating Parent, or Alienator; and parents who suffer the consequences of the Alienator as the Targeted Parent; and

WHEREAS, Parental Alienation deprives children of their right to love and be loved by the Targeted Parent; and,

WHEREAS, Parental Alienation takes advantage of the suggestible, impressionable and dependent nature of children; and

WHEREAS, Parental Alienation is considered harmful to children as the alienating tactics used on the children are confusing, frightening, and rob children of their sense of security; and


WHEREAS, speaking negatively about a parent to or in front of a child; interfering with communication and visitation; and discussing inappropriate information with a child can not only destroy the bond between a loving parent and child, but can cause a child mental and emotional harm; and

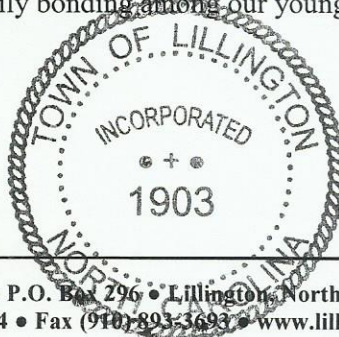
WHEREAS, there is little public awareness of Parental Alienation, and it is a growing issue in cases of divorce and separation; and


WHEREAS, education and awareness are effective tools against Parental Alienation; and
