WHEREAS:

Parental alienation describes behaviors and attitudes on the part of one parent or both parents designed to interfere or damage the relationship a child has with their other parent. It's a form of abuse that emotionally damages children and robs them of their sense of security; and

WHEREAS:

Mental professionals agree that the negative effects of parental alienation can follow a child into adulthood with tragic consequences; and

WHEREAS:

Approximately 40,000 children in the State of Alabama were subjected to child custody determination in 2014. Parental Alienation Prevention Week enhances the knowledge and understanding of this problem to help Alabamians, institutions, the legal and mental health community, and leaders to better identify and combat abusive behavior to children; and

WHEREAS:

In honor of Parental Alienation Prevention Week, come and show your support Tuesday, April 25, to blow soap "Bubbles For Love". Each bubble we blow represents the love our children have and should be allowed to share with both their parents.
